Qn.1 Ans (a)

Explanation:

- Section 58 outlines the general applicability of the Indian Succession Act. It excludes Muslims from its ambit and, except as provided in Section 57, also excludes Hindus, Buddhists, Sikhs, and Jainas.

- The court clarified that a nominee does not have absolute ownership rights. The nominee holds the property in trust until the legal heirs establish their claim.

Qn.5 Ans (c)

- Section 58(2) explicitly states that wills made before January 1, 1866, are not governed by the testamentary provisions of the Indian Succession Act.
